

The first step to create a new page, you need to edit an existing page, and on it add a link to the page you want to create.

To link to your new page, you must choose a name for it. The best names describe the page's contents well, so that everyone can find it. To create a link, surround the page name with **double brackets**. Typing `[[my new page]]` will create a link to [my new page](#). The

You can see that the links to [my new page](#) all have question marks after them. That's because [my new page](#) hasn't been written yet.

Another way to create a page: in your browser's address bar (where the page URL is), replace the name of the current page with the name of the new page, and click on the "Edit" link in order to create, edit, and save the new page.

The bad thing about this method is that there are no links to your new page, so you're the only person who knows it is there. It will be hard to find later.

How do I create a new page?

Typing `[[my new page]]` will create a link to the new page. There's [a lot you can do](#) with double bracket links.

Why do some new pages have a title with spaces like "Creating New Pages" and others end up with a WikiWord-like title like "CreatingNewPages"?

The default page title is simply the name of page, which is normally stored as "CreatingNewPages." However, you can override a page's title by adding a `[[title:My New Page]]` at the top of the page.
